- Practice phase 5 phonics on Purple Mash and use Youtube videos

- Practice number bonds to 10 and 20
- Practice counting in 1s, 2s, 5s and 10s to 100
- Practice reading time; hour, half past, quarter past and quarter to
- Recognising 3d and 2d shapes
- Word problems with numbers to 40
- Recognising and counting money
- Recognising halves and quarters of shapes and numbers
- Even and odd numbers

ART

- Draw a self-portrait
- Practice cutting in straight lines
- Can you create a pattern?

DT

- Can you make a toy from recycled materials?
- Can you make a moving object, that can push and pull?

SCIENCE

- What are the parts of a flower?
- What do plants need to grow?
- Can you recognise different types of trees?

RE

- What celebrations does your family take part in?
- Make a leaflet about a religion
- What is most important to you?
