ENGLISH

- Read 3 fiction books
- Read 3 non-fiction books
- Read 3 poems
- Write a character description including adjectives
- Write a book review based on your top 2 favourite books
- Write a diary entry on something exciting you've done (remember the features; date, address, 'dear diary', sign off)
- Can you write instructions on how to make something (features: title, materials, picture, numbers, instructions, time words, bossy verbs, adverbs)?
- Practice phase 5 phonics on Purple Mash and use Youtube videos
- Practice Year One tricky words
- Can you sequence your favourite book from this week?

MATHS

- Practice number bonds to 10 and 20
- Practice counting in 1s, 2s, 5s and 10s to 100
- Practice reading time; hour, half past, quarter past and quarter to
- Recognising 3D and 2D shapes
- Word problems with numbers to 40
- Recognising and counting money
- Recognising halves and quarters of shapes and numbers
- Even and odd numbers

ART

- Draw a picture of a landscape using dot art. Dot art can be achieved using paint, pencils, crayons or colouring pencils and involves making lots of small dots

DT

- Can you follow a recipe and make a lovely health snack?

SCIENCE

- Can you find out what materials float in water? Wood, plastic, fabric or metal?
- Write up your findings

- Why do Christians celebrate Easter?
- Why do Muslims celebrate Ramadan?

PE

- Can you create a dance routine?
