On this sheet you will find a series of tasks and activities relating to each area of the curriculum. The activities are designed to be used in case we need to close the school for any reason beyond our control. You can complete these activities when you want and how you want over the time that you are off school. Each activity or task is related to your year group, designed to be open ended, and can all be done at home with minimal resources.

ENGLISH

- Read a book of your choice and write a book review.
- Can you write a mystery story?
- Can you write 10 verbs? (run, jump etc.)
- Can you write 10 adverbs? (quickly, quietly etc.)
- Write a character description of your favourite superhero using adjectives.
- Write a book review based on 'The Owl Who was Afraid of the Dark' and 'I Need my Monster'.
- Write a diary entry on something exciting you've done (remember the features; date, address, 'dear diary', sign off)
- Practice phase 5 phonics on Purple Mash and use Youtube videos
- Practice Year One tricky words
- Can you sequence your favourite book from this week?

MATHS

- Practice number bonds to 10 and 20
- Practice counting in 1s, 2s, 5s and 10s to 100
- Practice reading time; hour, half past, quarter past and quarter to
- Identifying and recognising the properties of 3D and 2D shapes
- Addition and Subtraction word problems with numbers to 40
- Recognising and counting money. Try and set up your own shop and see if you can give your customers the right amount of change
- Recognising halves and quarters of shapes and numbers
- Even and odd numbers to 50

ART

- Draw a picture of your favourite memory.
- Make a collage using different materials in your house e.g. newspaper, cereal boxes and scrap paper.

DT

- Can you make a fruit salad using ingredients you have at home?
- Is it healthy? Does it look appealing?

SCIENCE

- What do deciduous trees and evergreen trees look like? What is the difference between the two? Can you have a go at drawing them? See if you can identify the trees in your local area.

RE

- Can you research a religious celebration? What is it called? When and why is it celebrated? How do people celebrate it?

PE

- Can you create a dance routine?
- Can you follow Joe Wicks daily youtube exercise?
- Can you come up with your own exercise routine?

COMPUTERS

- Activities should have been set on Purple Mash.
- Practice your typing skills.

GEOGRAPHY

- What country are your family from? What kind of food do they eat? What's the weather like? Can you draw the map?

HISTORY

- Do some research on Queen Elizabeth and make a poster. Who is she? Why is she famous? Where does she live? When was she born?

MUSIC

- Listen to your favourite song and see if you can recognise all the instruments used.
- Make your own beat using the instruments you made last week.

PSHE

- Learn the different parts of the body.
