On this sheet you will find a series of tasks and activities relating to each area of the curriculum. The activities are designed to be used in case we need to close the school for any reason beyond our control. You can complete these activities when you want and how you want over the time that you are off school. Each activity or task is related to your year group, is designed to be open ended, and can all be done at home with minimal resources.

### ENGLISH-continue to work through CGP Revision Guides

- Continue to read a variety of fiction and non-fiction books, or texts.
- Think of a new invention (food, car, piece of clothing, magical machine). How might you advertise it? How would you persuade people to buy it? Think about its special features, what makes it different, can you use rhetorical questions?
- Pick your favourite character that we learned about this year. Can you create a character description of them? What is their appearance like? What is their personality like?
- Write a recount of the story 'Library Lion'? Try to add as much detail as you can! You can write from a character's perspective if you like.
- Write two different versions of the same sentence but changing the adverb you have used. How does that change the meaning of the sentence? You could draw a picture to show what each one looks like.

### MATHS- continue to work through CGP Revision Guides

- Choose 5 different 2 digit-numbers. Can you partition each one in three different ways? Extra challenge- can you do this for 3-digit numbers?
- Create 5 number sequences starting on different numbers. What are you adding each time? Can you add in 3's? 4's? 11's?
- Draw a number line and add the numbers 11, 20, 19, 35, 6,  $\frac{1}{2}$  and 15. Think about where they would do in relation to each other.
- Complete some addition and subtraction questions using 2 digit-numbers. Can you solve each one using two different methods?
- Find some objects in your house and estimate its weight and length before measuring it. Can you estimate today's temperature?
- Keep learning your 2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables.

### ART

- Can you create a piece of art work that is similar to art from another country?
- Draw a picture of the view from your window.

### DT

- Design a package for the invention you came up with for your English advert.

### SCIENCE

- Design an item that might help to protect you from the sun. What materials would you use and why?
- Write an explanation for why your favourite pet would be better to have than a dinosaur.
- Explain how an animal can be adapted to its habitat.

### RE

- What celebrations do people from different religions have? What do they do? Why are they celebrating? What is the meaning of the celebration?

### PE

- Take part in Joe Wicks PE lessons
- How many times can you throw and catch a ball?
- Create your own dance or gymnastics routine to your favourite song.
- Find 5 different ways to balance-how long can you hold the balance for?

### COMPUTERS

- Activities will have been set on Purple Mash.
- Can you improve the speed that you type?
- Use Microsoft word to type sentences using capitals and punctuation.

### GEOGRAPHY

- On a map of the world can you label the 7 continents and 5 oceans?
- Can you find the UK? What countries make up the UK and what are the capital cities?

### HISTORY

- What was the Titanic? What happened to it? Why do people remember the Titanic?
- Can you find out any interesting facts about Hanwell in the past? Did anything important ever happen? Or did anyone special live there?

### MUSIC

- How many beats are there in a crotchet, quaver, minum and semibreve?
- Can you write down any other musical terms you've learned this year?
