

Year 2- Work in case of a forced school closure



On this sheet you will find a series of tasks and activities relating to each area of the curriculum. The activities are desgined to be used in case we need to close the school for any reason beyond our control. You can complete these activities when you want and how you want over the time that you are off school. Each activity or task is related to your year group, is designed to be open ended, and can all be done at home with minimal resources.

ENGLISH

- Read 5 fiction books.
- Read 5 non-fiction books.
- Write a poem based on your favourite season include similies, adverbs, alliteration and adjectives.
- Write a recount of your time off school (try to iclude speech marks, adjectives, adverbs and similes)
- Practise the Year 2 common exception spelling words
- Practise phase 5 and 6 phonics using Purple Mash and YouTube.
- Write a book review for each of the books that you have read
- Write a letter to convince your friend to read your favourite book (how might you be able to persuade them?)
- Write the most imaginative story you can think of (include a beginning, middle and an end)

MATHS

- Identify the different 2D/3D shapes and their sides and vertices
- Practise the 2,3, 5 and times tables
- Continue to practise your division facts using these times tables
- Practise adding and subtracting 2-digit numbers that require regrouping using different methods
- Practise fractions finding 1/2, ¼ and 1/3 of different amounts
- Practise reading the time in five minute intervals. Don't forget to practise reading the time to the hour, quarter past/to, half past
- Practise identifying money and adding money, can you find out how much change someone would get if they bought certain items?
- Practise solving word problems involving addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

ART

- Draw a still life picture
- Draw a self portrait
- Create a print

DT

- Create a finger puppet
- Create an object using salt dough
- Create a sandwich using your favourite ingredients

SCIENCE

- What are the different parts of a plant?
- What do all living things need to grow?
- Conduct an experiment using a paper cup telephone – at what distance do you stop hearing your partner?
- Can you create a healthy meal plan?

RE

- Prepare a poster about one of the religions we have learned about this term (Hinduism, Islam)
- Research the term 'co-operation' and write a diary about a time that you cooperated. How did it make you feel?
 Why did you do it?

PΕ

- Travel across a room in 5 different ways.
- HIT- Using the exercises we have been practicing at morning play, design an exercise programme to share with your family. It should include 5 exercises for 1 minute each.
- Practise throwing and catching

- Practise your handwriting/ letter formation.
