## **ENGLISH**

#### Grammar:

- Write three sentences, using 'an' in them.
- Can you write three different prefixes for the following words; 'angle' 'vision' 'circle'
- Give examples of each of the following concepts we use in English; adverbs, verbs, adjectives, noun preposition and determiners.
- Make up ten funny sentences using two nouns, E.g; A teacher drinks sadly in the chair.

**Reading**: Read your favorite book and write a review. Remember: The title and the author, What did you like about the book? What did you dislike about the book? Did you have a favorite part that you can write about in depth? Can you make up your own illistrations for your book? Can you think of an alternative ending to your book?

**Writing:** Can you write diary entries for each day you are not in school. Remember to add what work you do!

**Money:** On a piece of paper, can you add up the price of the groceries your parent/carer are getting for their weekly shop before they reach the check out? Were you close?

**Time:** Log the time you do the following activities: wake up, breakfast, television, playing, lunch, exercise, dinner, reading, bath time, bedtime.

**Times Tables:** Get a family member to test you on your times tables. You should be confident in your 3, 4, 5, 6, and 8 times tables.

## ART

Pick a dry day to go out and collect twigs, different colour leaves and grass. Can you create your own natural picture? Have fun!

## DT

Can you make a pop-up picture book using cardboard?

# SCIENCE

What happens to a picture when it is placed behind a glass of water (refraction) Before you start, make a prediction! Draw 3 or 4 small pictures, place one picture behind the glass of water. Has the picture changed? Repeat with the other three pictures.
