ENGLISH

Angles

Can you write the definition of an angle?

What are the 4 different types of angles (yes, there are FOUR!) We have not covered one in school yet. Can you research and find out what it is called. Ensure you draw and describe all 4 angles in your book.

Go around your household and identify different angles on your furniture and parts of your room.

Perimeter

What is a perimeter of a shape and how do you find it? Write the definition and practise finding the perimeter of different shapes.

ART- Still life

Can you select items in your household and try and draw these as realistically as possible?

(Shading, highlights and details)

DT- Transport

There are all sorts of bags; backpacks, handbags, shoulder bags, strap bags and plastic bags- but can YOU design the bag of the future and give it your own special features?

SCIENCE- Life Cycle of a plant

Research and create a poster showing an illustrated and labelled life-cycle of a plant.

RE / PSHE

Create a radio interview with a relative and have interview questions prepared about their religion or beliefs.

Write your responses down from the interviewee When you have written your interview script ask a different relative or friend to read one of the parts and act out your interview together. It would be so much fun if you can record the session. Remember your handwriting!

Here are some questions you can ask:

- Do you have a religion. If so, why?
- •What holidays do you celebrate and why?
- Do you wear any special clothes for any celebrations. If so, why?
- Do you have a special book that you read from? If yes, does the book bring you comfort?
