ENGLISH

Reading

Writing-

Create an Adventure story.

- Develop a plan for your story, thinking about setting, plot and characters characters.
- Use a plan to develop a sequence and structure for your story (setting the scene, build up, climax, resolution, ending)
- Use speech marks within your narrative, can you also include fronted adverbials and noun phrases.

Once you have finished your adventure story can you turn it into a graphic novel. Can you use detailed images to tell your story, using caption boxes to set the scene and speech bubbles for characters dialogue. Make them as colourful and detailed as possible.

MATHS

- Learn your 2.4.6.7 times tables.
- On purple mash complete the maths tasks set for you weekly.
- Go on a scavenger hunt of items around your house that you think weight a certain amount. For example find a bag of sugar that weights 500g. What else feels like it weighs the same. Write your findings down and check you answers using scales.
- Challenge yourself to find different angles around the house. Record how many right angles, obtuse angles and acute angles you find.

Tip: Think about using milk carton lids for wheels, a balloon to make your car move, straws as a rotating axel.
