



Year 5- Work in case of a forced school closure



On this sheet you will find a series of tasks and activities relating to each area of the curriculum. The activities are designed to be used in case we need to close the school for any reason beyond our control. You can complete these activities when you want and how you want over the time that you are off school. Each activity or task is related to your year group, designed to be open ended, and can all be done at home with minimal resources.

ENGLISH

- Read 5 fiction books and 5 non-fiction books
- Write a review for each one
- What was it about? What did you enjoy about it? What did you dislike? Who would you recommend it to?
- Write a character description about at least three characters from the books that you have read. Describe their looks, personality and adventures
- Write a story about some of the characters who you have read about
- Write a letter to and from some of the characters in the books which you have read
- Write a poem about some of the characters
- Make a checklist of all of the features which you have used in your writing
- Look up Year 5 and Year 6 spellings using images. Learn as many of these spellings as you can. Use them in your own sentences
- Write 5 questions using READING VIPERS
- Look for online comprehension exercises (Year 5, KS2)
- Look at the BBC Bitesize site for all subjects

MATHS

- Learn all of your times tables. Learn all division facts. Use them to make up word problems.
- Practice number bonds to 100, 1000, 10000 and 100000
- Add the ages of everyone living in your house mentally. What is the difference between different people
- Make a list of things you will get at your next shopping trip. Estimate the cost of each and then work out how much the total will be
- How many different shapes can you find in your house? Make a list
- What is the difference in temperature between your freezer and your living room?
- Work out how long you sleep, watch TV, read, play computer games etc. Work out what $\frac{1}{2}$ $\frac{1}{3}$ $\frac{1}{4}$ $\frac{1}{5}$ and $\frac{1}{10}$ of these amounts are
- Find 3 items from your fridge. Find the total weight of these objects. What three objects have the greatest weights?
- Find 3 drinks and find their total volume. Write in litres and millilitres

ART

- Draw the views from different parts of your home
- Draw/paint picture of Ancient Egyptian buildings
- Write notes to family in hieroglyphs

DT

- Make models of Ancient Egyptian pyramids/buildings
- Make an Ancient Egyptian boat.

SCIENCE

- Research planets in our solar system
- Make a quiz about the universe/moon/earth etc.
- Find out all you can about gravity

RE

- Find out about at least 3 different religions
- What do they believe?
- Where do they pray?
- What are their celebrations, food etc.

PE

- How many times can you jump in a minute
- Run up and down the stairs?
- How long can you jog on the spot for ?

COMPUTERS

- Look on Purple Mash for any work set
- Use Purple Mash to explore
- Find out about a job you might like to do

GEOGRAPHY

- Find out the capital cities of the world
- Make a list of countries on each continent
- Research rivers and mountains of the world
- Research a major city in the world

HISTORY

Create a project on Ancient Egypt: Find out about everyday life, the Pharaohs, pyramids, the Nile, farming, hieroglyphs, mummification.

MUSIC

- Write a song. Practise and perform it
- Find out about a famous musician/ composer
- Find the words to a song you like and sing along
- Tap out the beats to different songs

PSHE

- Create a poster on how we can look after our planet
- Produce an anti- bullying poster
