



Year 6- Work in case of a forced school closure



On this sheet you will find a series of tasks and activities relating to each area of the curriculum. The activities are designed to be used in case we need to close the school for any reason beyond our control. You can complete these activities when you want and how you want over the time that you are off school. Each activity or task is related to your year group, designed to be open ended, and can all be done at home with minimal resources.

ENGLISH

Grammar: Create a mind map of all the concepts covered in grammar this year, providing examples of each one. Make it as colourful and attractive as possible. Be prepared to share these with the class.

Reading: Complete a book review of the current book you are reading. You can also choose a character to write about, giving details about their personality and appearance etc. Complete any pages from the reading workbook, using the revision guide to help you.

Writing: Write a poem about a topic of your choice, using all the figures of speech we have discussed in class. You can create any type of poem and type it up if you can.

OR

Write a sequel based around our current book. Think about the style of author and the audience and purpose of the story. You can add some more characters if you wish.

MATHS

In preparation for the SATs, students can complete a series of tasks relating to the three maths papers (Arithmetic, Reasoning 2, Reasoning 3) they will be sitting in May.

Arithmetic practice:

Complete any pages that you haven't done so far. Especially concepts that you find tricky. Ask an adult for help, or use Purple Mash.

Reasoning:

Create a bingo times table game to play with your family. You be the leader of the game and ask the questions, check their answers once someone has shouted BINGO!

ART

Sketch a building or landmark that you have visited recently.

DT

Create a 3D model relating to any subject we have covered this year. Use recycled materials. For example, create an Anderson Shelter or a model Spitfire.

SCIENCE

Can you carry out a short experiment to test the effects of exercise on your heart rate (see if this is different for other members of your family) Write up your experiment under the following headings:

- Aim
- Prediction
- Method
- Fair test
- Results/conclusion

RE

Choose a religion to research and create a powerpoint presentation

PE

- Make up a circuit that you and your family can complete in a time limit
- Think about the skills we have learnt about in our PE lessons

COMPUTERS

- Use Purple Mash to complete any coding areas that you did not complete
- Complete a spreadsheet based around a menu that you create

GEOGRAPHY

Research a country of your choice. Create a fact file including the following subheadings:

- Population
- Landmarks
- Location/map
- Flag
- Culture/traditions
- Fun facts

HISTORY

Create a timeline from a significant period in history. For example, WW1. This should include main events, key dates, influential people of the time etc.

MUSIC

- Listen to a different genre of music, can you list the different instruments that you can hear?
- Make a poster of your favourite musician

PSHE

Make something for a member of your family. This could be anything from cooking them something special to making a photo frame or card. Let them know what they mean to you.
