

Year 6 Work in case of a forced school closure



On this sheet you will find a series of tasks and activities relating to each area of the curriculum. You can complete these activities when you want and how you want over the time that you are off school. Each activity or task are related to your year group and designed to be open ended and can all be done at home with minimal resources.

ENGLISH

- Go on to Pobble365 website each day and use the image to answer the questions they ask underneath. Choose an area each day to complete.
- Note down any unfamiliar words from any reading you have done. Explore
 the meanings of these words by using a dictionary, reading around the
 sentence or using print conventions.
- Read 5 newspaper or magazine articles. Summarise each in less than 20 words
- Read the lyrics to 5 songs you like on Youtube (make sure you search for the clean versions). Find examples of rhyme, alliteration, metaphor, similes, personification, imagery and symbolism.
- Think of a debate question. Write arguments for and against and then split your family into two teams. Debate for and against in the best way possible.
- Write a leaflet encouraging your neighbours to join in with applause for the NHS each Thursday at 8pm.

MATHS

- Complete any of the revision pages for the maths books that have been left over. Although you won't be sitting your SATS you will still need to learn all these concepts for high school!
- Teach a younger sibling a maths concept.
- Choose one area of maths e.g. decimals. Write down everything you know about this topic- be creative as possible using pictures, diagrams and methods you have learnt.
- Choose any time during the day. Work out what the time was: 10 mins before, 25 mins before, 45 mins before, 1 hour and 17 mins before. Then work out what the time will be in 10 mins, 30 mins, 45 mins and 1 hour and 45 mins. Do this each day please.
- Create some shapes using paper, these could be shapes such as triangles, hexagons and squares. Find all the lines of symmetry in them.
- Have a go at some tessellation art!
