This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – Curriculum Music, Co-Curricular Provision and Musical Experiences – and what changes we are planning for future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum Music

At Brentside Primary Academy, our vision is to enable all children and young people to learn to sing, play an instrument, create music together, and have the opportunity to progress their musical interests and talents, including professionally. This means all children and young people:

- Experience a broad musical culture in schools and education settings, accessing highquality curricular and co-curricular music, and progressing into appropriate qualifications
- Access the expertise, instruments, technology and facilities they need to learn, create and share their music
- Engage with a range of enrichment opportunities to play and sing, to perform, create and experience live music, and have their music heard
- Have opportunities to progress their musical interests and talents, and routes into a variety of music careers
- Are supported by a skilled and dynamic workforce

We also expect music education to be fully inclusive, so that all music educators:

- Commit to achieving greater access and more opportunity in music education, identifying and removing barriers, including for children in low-income families and children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND)
- Take action to support increasing access, opportunity, participation, and progression of groups that are currently under-represented in music
- Support understanding of inclusive music education and skills development among teachers, tutors, practitioners and leaders, informed by high-quality research and evidence

Brentside's curriculum is informed by the <u>model music curriculum</u> (March 2021), non-statutory guidance for teaching music from Key Stages 1 to 3, and Charanga.

Pupil Opportunities

Pupils have the following opportunities to sing or play an instrument within lesson time:

- Singing in class
- Singing in assemblies
- Singing for concerts
- Opportunities to play percussion instruments as a full class
- Opportunities to play tuned instruments as a full class
- Year 3, 5 & 6 whole class ukulele lessons
- Year 4 whole class recorder lessons
- Years 1 and 2 whole class glockenspiel lessons
- Years 5 & 6 whole class music technology lessons

Partnerships Information

- BPA partner with Charanga, which is a music programme which is used to provide model music for the curriculum
- BPA partnership with Ealing Music Services for workshops
- BPA partner with Young Voices to participate in and attend their concert bi-annually
- BPA Partner with private music tutors to provide peripatetic paid for music lessons
- BPA Partner with other local schools for CPD and visit to attend concerts

Part B: Co-Curricular Music

Pupils have the following opportunities to sing or play an instrument outside of lesson time:

- Music tutoring on individual instruments; such as keyboard, guitar, violin, drums for KS2 pupils. Chargeable to parents at £5 for 20 minutes, half price for Pupil Premium pupils.
- Choir Club- KS2
- Choir Trips (such as visit to St David's Care Home)- KS2
- Samba Club- KS2
- Hanwell Carnival (drumming march)- KS2
- Young Voices- attend online events and Wembley arena for concert bi-annually- KS2
- Termly instrumental concerts- KS2
- World Music Day- Whole school
- Brentside's Got Talent competition- Whole school
- World's Biggest Sing events- KS2
- Music workshops- Whole school
- Music Therapy- Whole school
- · After school clubs for music- Whole school
- Year 6 production- Year 6
- Free instrument loans: keyboards, guitars & violins- KS2

Pupils are able to rehearse in the Music room, stage hall or their classrooms. Pupils have access to the ICT room for Music Technology.
