### Initiatives / Improvements:

Part of the Pupil Premium allocation has gone towards whole school improvements, which include some of the initiatives listed below:-

- Increase in the number of days the Play therapist attends the school to help children with social, emotional and behavioural issues
- Pupil premium students charged a discounted rate for school trips or helped with the entire cost
- Pupil premium students were charged a discounted rate for the residential trip to Kingswood
- 3 support teachers to provide extra help in the classroom and to take small groups for lessons.
- 2 support TAs to help with the wellbeing of pupils
- Before school SATs club to help students, including pupil premium students, with SATs preparations. These clubs take place throughout the year

## The Impact of Pupil Premium Funding on Trips 2018-19

We are working to encourage the take up of the reduced rate offered to pupil premium pupils for trips. It was introduced this year to ensure that pupil premium pupils get additional discounts on trips, this is to make them more accessible. We have now increased the pupil premium discount to half the cost of the trip for local visits.
