Seasons	The cycle of weather changes is divided into four parts, known as the seasons . The four seasons are winter, spring, summer, and autumn, or fall.
Weather	Weather is what the sky and the air outside feel and look like.
Meteorologist	A meteorologist is a person whose job it is to forecast the weather.
Forecast	A prediction of what the weather will be like
