What skills I already have:

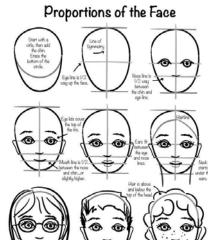
I can use my imagination to draw pictures of myself, family and friends. I can incorporate some facial features in my work.
