Past	A period of history from a long time ago
Present	Something from right now
Broken	Something that does not work
Shiny	A smooth object, very clean
Rusty	An object has changed colour by age
Clean	No dirt, marks or stains on an object
Plastic	A man made material, can be hard or soft, usually shiny
Wood	A natural material, comes from trees
Metal	A solid material can be hard, shiny, and smooth
Fabric	Cloth , a soft material
