

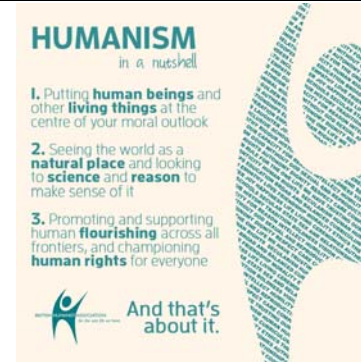
Brentside Knowledge Organiser - RE

Golden Rule	Treat others the way that you would like to be treated yourself
Afterlife	The place that you go/ what happens to you after you die
Worship	The act of showing respect and love for a god or religion
