 Children know about Christianity, Humanism, Buddhism, Sikhism, Hinduism and the main symbols of these.

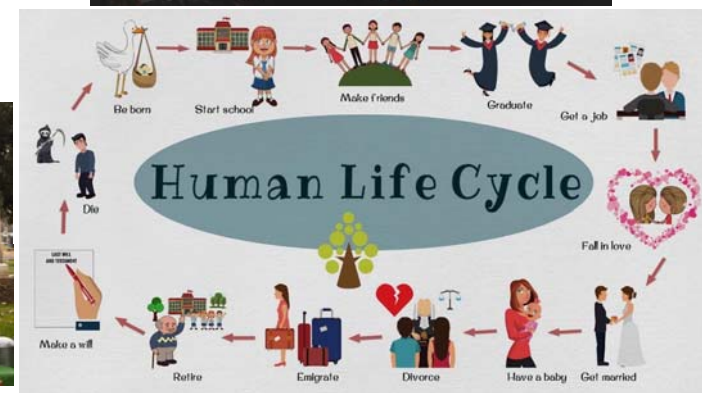
What I should know at the end of the topic:
