

Vocabulary	
Print	Are made from an original surface called a matrix .
Block	Two freshly painted surfaces stuck together when pressed against each other .
Colour	Primary colours are red, yellow and blue. Secondary colours are made by mixing those.
Technique	A skill used to carry out a task.
Repeated patterns	Repetition refers to one object or shape repeated; pattern is a combination of elements or shapes repeated in a recurring and regular arrangement.
