I can be aware of the Ten Days Repentance of High Holy days.

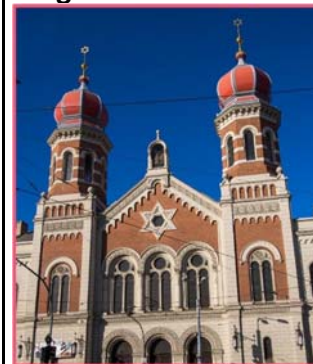
I can recognise the importance of celebration within Judaism and identify when this takes place.
