Vocabulary	
Exhibition	A public display of works of art or items of interest, held in an art gallery or museum or at a trade fair.
Museum	A building in which objects of historical, scientific, artistic, or cultural interest are stored and exhibited.
Display	Put (something) in a prominent place in order that it may easily be seen.
Artefact	an object made by a human being, typically one of cultural or historical interest.
Sculpt	create or represent (something) by carving, casting, or other shaping techniques.
Clay	A stiff, sticky fine-grained earth, typically yellow, red, or bluish-grey in colour and often forming an impermeable layer in the soil. It can be moulded when wet, and is dried and baked to make bricks, pottery, and ceramics.
Mouldable	Capable of being moulded especially with the use of earth or clay or other soft materials.
