Vocabulary

Shahada	The Shahada is the Muslim declaration of faith and the first Pillar of Islam . It expresses the belief that there is no god but Allah and that Muhammad is the messenger of Allah.
Shirk	someone who believes that there is more than one God
Taqwa	Fear of God/ to protect yourself from what angers Allah.
Iman	Belief in the six articles of faith
Jiahd	Struggle or effort – for example a believers struggle to live out the Muslim faith as well as possible.
Prophet	Individuals who serve as examples of ideal human behavior and to spread God's message on Earth
