Learning -

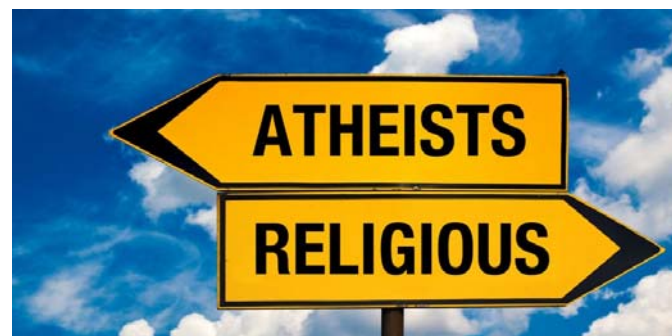
Describe the religious profile of the United Kingdom and how this has changed over time.
