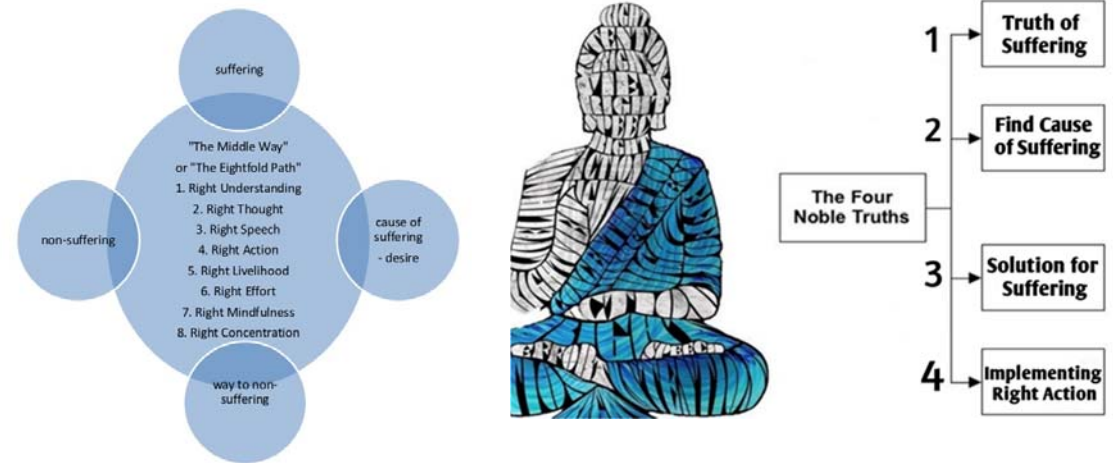
What did Buddha believe was the main cause of human suffering?

Noble truths	These are the four main issues faced by humans, Buddha offers support on how to overcome these issues
Eightfold path	This is eight key areas for humans to focus on to live a content and happy life .
Five precepts	A way of life often adopted by Buddhist monks.
Lobha	A term used in Buddhism to describe greed
Samsara	The cycle through life, death and re-birth
nirvana	A state of enlightenment and contentment felt by Buddhists when they adopt a pure life.
