
What I should already know:

Pupils should be taught to recognise that the word 'church' carries different meanings: theological, institutional, sociological and architectural. Appreciate that Christians understand the church as both united to, and as an expression on earth of, Jesus.

Recognise that the church is also symbolic of the Christian community.

Understand the significance of the church for Christian worship.

Be sensitive to the forms of behaviour and activities that are appropriate within a church.



What I should know at the end of the topic:	
Appreciate that the church extends across the world and that it is very diverse.	
Acknowledge the centrality of worship within the ministry and mission of the church.	
Understand that Christian worship involves a combination of words, images, actions, gestures, symbols, music and movement.	
Recognise that the Roman Catholic Church contains the largest number of Christian believers.	
Recognise the other major denominations: Eastern Orthodox, Anglican, Lutheran, Methodist, Baptist, Quaker, Evangelical, Charismatic and Pentecostal.	
Appreciate that some Christians particularly appreciate silence and stillness in worship.	
Understand what a sacrament is and what role the sacraments play in some kinds of Christian worship.	

Vocabulary		
Denomination	The word denomination is used for a large group of Christian people right across the world who use the same name, the same sort of organisation and have the same (or very similar) beliefs.	
Liturgy	Rite or system of rituals prescribed for public worship in any Christian denomination or church—a custom or repetition of ideas, phrases, or observances.	
Congregation	Christian religious organisation or congregation or community that meets in a particular location.	
Procession	The act of moving along or proceeding in orderly succession or in a formal and ceremonious manner.	
Confession	Act of telling one's life story as a series of failings or tribulations. Something confessed, especially a disclosure of one's sins to a priest for absolution.	
Blessing	To pronounce a wish of happiness onto someone, or to set apart for holy purposes, to praise or glorify God or the Lord Jesus Christ, to speak God's goodness to one another.	
Intercession	Prayer that pleads with God for your needs and the needs of oth-
