

Key	A map key or legend is included with a map to unlock it. It gives you the information needed for the map to make sense.		
brochure	a small book or magazine containing pictures and information about a place		
OS map	Ordnance Survey (OS) is the national mapping agency for Great Britain		
Compass	An instrument containing a magnetized pointer which shows the direction of magnetic north and bearings from it.
